WEEK 11 UPDATE: April 18, 2015

This is a big THANK YOU to all of you who contacted the below listed <u>Assembly Ways and Means Committee</u> members and asked them to oppose <u>AB190</u> – NV PERS – Hybrid Bill by Anti-Public Employee <u>Assemblyman Randy Kirner</u> (R) and co-sponsored by Assemblymen <u>Wheeler</u> (R), <u>Hickey</u> (R), <u>Jones</u> (R), <u>Dickman</u> (R), <u>Ellison</u> (R), <u>Hansen</u> (R) and <u>Oscarson</u> (R).

On Wednesday, April 15, <u>Assemblyman Kirner</u> again provided non-credible, inflated and erroneous non-factual information to the Committee and all of us in attendance in his hope of somehow convincing the Committee that he was right in claiming that NV PERS was on its way to bankruptcy. He brought in some "experts" who attempted to reinforce <u>Assemblyman Kirner's</u> testimony. This testimony was rebutted by NV PERS executive officer <u>Tina Leiss</u>.

All in all <u>Tina Leiss</u> and the independent actuary experts from the <u>Segal firm</u> contradicted <u>Kirner</u> and his "experts" and provided the "other side" of why PERS was best in class and extremely well run. <u>More important was the fiscal note of over \$745 million dollars which by itself will cause the bill to die.</u>

Our public coalition group stayed on point and presented testimony all in opposition to <u>AB190</u>. No action was taken by the committee at that point. The hearing lasted four and one half hours.

<u>Assemblyman Anderson</u>, chairman of the <u>Assembly Ways and Means Committee</u> is to be commended for providing equal time to both the proponents and opponents in presenting both sides to this unneeded legislation.

We learned yesterday (April 17, 2015) that there was a possibility of deals being made between the Senate republicans and Senate democrats on the Governor's tax plan (SB252). Here is the link from the LVRJ:

Our coalition leadership received an e-mail from <u>Senator Ford</u> stating that our labor coalition need not "fret" about the deals.

We learned this week that there was a possibility that all collective bargaining bills <u>AB182</u>, <u>AB249</u>, <u>AB280</u>, <u>SB158</u> and <u>SB168</u> would most likely be referred to the <u>Ways and Means</u> <u>Committee</u> with a fiscal note. Ironically, <u>AB249</u> was the first to be referred and included a fiscal note of \$300K to add the position of Deputy Commissioner to the <u>Employee Management</u> Relations Board (EMRB).

The last two days of this week were spent observing the Senate and Assembly floor sessions where the non-exempt bills have until April 21 to be voted out of their respective house or face the dreaded "indefinite postponed" (Killed) label.

Yesterday <u>SB241</u>, <u>Senator Roberson's</u> collective bargaining bill was amended to oust judicial employees from collective bargaining. This was supposedly re-amended and removed but that is yet to be seen. It seems that the judicial branch of government believes that it has complete control over its employees, even though it does not employ employees. The state, county and city's employ employees.

OK....that is it for week 11. There are 45 days left in this legislation session.
